

Naga body demands early settlement of border issue

DIMAPUR, May 7: United Naga Tribes Association on Border Areas (UNTABA) has urged Nagaland Chief Minister Shurhozelie Leizietsu to review the Interim Agreements of 1972, 1979 and other MoUs among Nagaland, Assam and Central Governments.

It alleged that such stop-gap arrangements were made under duress against the very history of Naga people and has become a stumbling block for development, peace and tranquillity in the border areas.

UNTABA officials led by its chairman Hukavi T Yeputhomi made the appeal through a memorandum when they met the CM in Kohima on Thursday.

Maintaining that the Naga people's movement for bringing back the transferred Naga lands was the beginning of the Naga

political movement, the memorandum sought settlement of the inter-State boundary between Assam and Nagaland.

The memorandum also demanded removal or revocation of the Disputed Area Belt (DAB) in the Naga areas since it is against the basic principle of dignity of citizens in their own land.

It said the historical and traditional Naga lands of the entire border belt between Nagaland and Assam from Peren to Mon district had no dispute with Assam whatsoever or with any tribe. It further stated that no authority can bifurcate Naga areas into sectors as DAB against the very wishes of the people.

The UNTABA also urged the State Government to deploy Nagaland Armed Police (NAP) in the border areas immediately and to establish polling stations in all the villages in the border areas at the earliest.

Garo woman goes missing

TURA, May 7: A 22 year-old woman from Makre Adap village under Kharkutta Police Station in North Garo Hills has gone missing since March 26 with a desperate family suspecting trafficking to be the reason for her disappearance.

Sasitha G Momin, who worked as a domestic help in the house of a sub inspector in Shillong was apparently on her way home to Makre Adap from Shillong but never reached home. She has since been missing with the last contact with the family being made in the middle of April last.

"Her number has been out of reach. But she called a few times from different numbers narrating that she was being led by different men and was most possibly in Manipur. We filed an FIR in Kharkutta PS on April 13 but there is word on her whereabouts," said the father. - Correspondent

Amit Shah calls for regime change in Tripura

AGARTALA, May 7: BJP national president Amit Shah on Sunday appealed to the people of Tripura for a regime change on the plea that the State remained backward despite heavy flow of fund from the Centre.

Tripura remained deprived during Congress-led UPA regime even though the Marxists have an understanding with Congress, he said, while addressing a party rally at Kumarghat in Unakoti district.

"While Tripura received Rs 10,000 crore during UPA-II regime, Narendra Modi Government released over Rs 25,000 crore during past three years", he pointed out. Despite enough fund flow, the State did not grow as it was expected due to corruption and malpractices by the

ruling CPI(M) leaders, he alleged.

Coming down heavily on Rose Valley chit fund issue, Shah said, "If CBI probe is ordered into the ponzi firm scam, money will come out from ruling party's leaders. On moral ground, Chief Minister must order CBI probe into the scam".

Aiming to woo the employees, Shah promised recommendations of 7th Central Pay Commission will be implemented for the employees, as also pension, if BJP is voted to power. "The first State Cabinet meeting will pass the decision for the welfare of the employees and pensioners", he said.

Electricity has reached to every household even in rural areas while ambulance is at the people's door step in BJP-ruled States like Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh and Maharashtra, he said.

"Is every hamlet covered with elec-

tricity in Tripura..... Do you have ambulance facility to your door step? These facilities will be available if BJP is voted to power", he said amidst cheers.

"I have been touring the entire nation and witnessing development but Tripura blessed with nature's bounty is still lagging behind. Corruption and nepotism are seen everywhere", he alleged.

Urging people to vote for BJP, Shah promised Tripura will surely flourish if the party is voted to power in 2018 Assembly elections.

Among others, Union Minister of State for Health and Family Welfare Faggan Singh Kulaste and Assam Finance Minister Himanta Biswa Sharma also spoke in the rally. Earlier, Shah went to Udaipur in Gomati district by a chopper and offered prayer in Tripureswari temple.

BSF firing: Garo villagers allege fake encounter

Tura, May 7: Residents of Belabor village have refuted Border Security Force (BSF's) claim that men of BSF posted at Kachu Adokgre in West Garo Hills had apprehended a group of cattle smugglers, who with public support had attacked them forcing them to shoot two of them in the leg.

But the villagers alleged that the incident took place on Friday at about 11 am when the BSF men fired at villagers in the leg when they went to stop cattle smugglers. The villagers also filed an FIR against the BSF men.

A press release by BSF had claimed that four people were apprehended in the case with the two injured being rushed to Tura Civil Hospital for medical care.

The villagers, however, had a different version. Alleging that the BSF men of passing off villagers as cattle smugglers.

"How can cattle smuggling take place in broad daylight with

the presence of security personnel all along the border," asked a villager. According to them the troops were in two vehicles.

Anil S Sangma, a resident of Belabor was allegedly pulled aside and questioned about cattle smuggling and later let off. Afterwards the BSF men moved towards Kochu Adokgre, 3 kms from Purakhasia.

On spotting the son of Nokma of Belabor, Namseng Ch Sangma, tending six cattle heads, the troops accused him of attempting to smuggle the cattle to Bangladesh. Namseng was one of the two men shot in the leg.

Villagers quickly rushed to the spot when the security men were rounding up cattle. Despite their pleas that the cows belonged to them, the troops refused to listen leading to an escalation in the matter and firing.

District police officers along with a magistrate later arrived at the scene. District police chief, Dr MGR Kumar said, "Investigation into the incident is on."

The board would also make specific recommendations to the State Government through the Social Justice, Empowerment and Tribal Affairs (SJETA) department.

SJETA is the nodal department to achieve all round development of the Puroiks and bring them into the mainstream of the society like other tribal people of the State, the release added. – PTI

Arunachal Minister demands special power package

ITANAGAR, May 7: Arunachal Pradesh Power Minister Tamiyo Taga has demanded a special package to ensure 24-hour electricity in the Northeastern State.

Emerging from the Power and Energy Ministers conference in New Delhi recently, Taga submitted a memorandum to Union Power Minister Piyush Goyal and demanded a special package for Arunachal, an official statement said.

In the memorandum, Taga stated that the special package was needed to convert the inherited approach of minimum need base to providing affordable and quality grid power to all households while making efforts to achieve the dream of Prime Minister of providing 24x7 power to all in a scheduled target.

The Minister also stressed on the need for special package in the light of being a resource crunched State, while expressing hope on the vision of the PM for ensuring overall development of NE States especially underdeveloped ones like Arunachal Pradesh, it said. – PTI

Oppose Citizenship Bill: PRISM

AIZAWL, May 7: Aizawl-based anti-corruption watchdog, People's Right to Information and Development Society of Mizoram (PRISM), on Saturday urged the people to raise their voice and stage protest against the Citizenship (Amendment) Bill 2016.

The Bill seeks to make illegal migrants of certain minority communities from Afghanistan, Bangladesh and Pakistan eligible for Indian citizenship.

In a press statement, PRISM said the executive committee meeting of the body yesterday decided to involve all political parties and NGOs of the State in protesting against the

proposed legislation.

"The Bill, if passed, would cause serious demographic crisis in India. It will affect those regions in North East which share international border with Bangladesh, Nepal and Myanmar," the statement said.

The statement further said that the proposed legislation seeks to grant citizenship to any Hindu, Parsi, Jain, Buddhist and Christian who entered India and stayed in the country for six years.

PRISM expressed apprehension that illegal immigrants from Bangladesh in western parts of Mizoram would be granted citizenship if the proposed Bill becomes a law. - PTI
