

## Migrant desk Don Bosco Bharosa inaugurated

**GUWAHATI, Feb 26:** Don Bosco Bharosa, a migrant desk of the Salesian Province of Guwahati, was opened on February 24, said a press release issued here on Friday.

*Bharosa* in Hindi means trust. The young job seeking population in general has a trust on the Don Bosco brand. Similarly, job providers trust that the employees recommended by Don Bosco institutions will be honest and hard working, the press release claimed.

Migrant desks set up by the Don Bosco Society are in all the major cities of India. The North East will have three centres at Dimapur, Guwahati and Shillong with many more sub centres.

During the inaugural programme, Fr A Jayaprakash, director of Don Bosco Bharosa, said, "Our north-eastern desks will network with similar desks in others parts of the country. As the migrant youth from North East India are spread out in all major cities, the main objective of Don Bosco Bharosa will be to provide safe migration to them. If the migrant youth of our region face any problem in any part of the country they will be assisted by the nearest migrant desk of the Don Bosco Society."

The migrant desk in Guwahati will have five sub centres. These will be located in Kamrup Metro district, Assam plains, Karbi linguistics region of Assam, Bodo linguistics region of Assam and Garo Hills districts of Meghalaya. The desk will at the moment, be collecting data. A placement cell to be based in Guwahati will help the youth to get safe jobs.

The office space dedicated to Don Bosco Bharosa was inaugurated by Fr Sebastian Kuricheal, SDB, Rector and Principal of Don Bosco School Guwahati, the release added.
